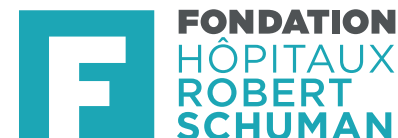

As the sole shareholder of Santé Services SA, a healthcare services company, FHRS also owns the Gesondheetszentrum, a centre dedicated to screening and preventive medicine.
